

August 2021 Resources: Systemic Inequities in Primary/ Secondary and Higher Education

This month we have collected resources pertinent to 1) disparities in primary/secondary education with particular focus on the school-to-prison pipeline and 2) disparities with regards to access to, opportunity for, and experiences with higher education. Youth of color are disproportionately targets of higher rates of harsh school discipline which has long-standing effects on learning and incarceration rates (African Americans make up two fifths and Hispanics one fifth of confined youth). The disparity in discipline is long-lasting as there are several roadblocks that the global majority, especially Black youth, face as they access higher education. We hope this resource blast will help educate our community on these important issues.
